This audit will focus on gathering evidence-based information related to the quality of academic programs by assessing various parameters such as curriculum, teaching methods, learning approaches, faculty profiles, and student profiles. The goal of the Academic Audit is to foster a culture of continuous evaluation and improvement, ensuring the sustained application of best practices in academic programs.

## Methodology:

The auditors visited the Departments, including the library and interacted with the Departmental Heads, faculty members, and the Librarian. After close examination of the information sheets furnished by the departments, priorities of the audit are determined. Detailed discussions with the faculty of the department about all aspects of academics and other allied activities are made. All the records are examined to find out the strength and weakness. Facilities showcasing the teachers' and students' activities like Wall Magazine, Seminar Bulletins, Annual Reports and Activities Albums are accessed and duly analyzed to evaluate the quality of teaching learning. The Internal Academic Audit was conducted based on the following criteria:

- 1. Curriculum Transaction and Teaching-Learning-Evaluation
- 2. Faculty Profile
- 3. Infrastructure
- 4. Library
- 5. Departmental Profile

# 1. Curriculum Transaction and Teaching-Learning-Evaluation: Audit Observations:

- After discussing with the teachers and students of the Departments, it was
  discovered that all Departments consistently engage in teaching-learning activities
  and continuous internal assessment. The Departments strictly follow the
  University's Academic Calendar and develop a lesson plan at the beginning of each
  Semester to ensure effective curriculum delivery.
- 2. Departmental meetings are convened regularly to discuss updates in the course structure and to allocate the University-prescribed syllabus among faculty members.
- 3. In the First Semester, undergraduate students from various departments have submitted project reports for the Environmental Studies course and different paper of Honours subjects. Additionally, students majoring in Geography and Zoology have submitted project reports based on field studies throughout their semesters.
- 4. The College has five ICT-enabled classrooms, but most Departments predominantly use the chalk-and-talk method for teaching.
- 5. The Departments regularly employ continuous internal assessment to evaluate students' understanding of specific subjects through examinations, assignments, project works, and seminar presentation.
- 6. Regular Parent-Teachers' meeting has been conducted by each of the Departments.
- 7. Regular feedbacks are obtained from the various stakeholders, especially from the students that are then analyzed and utilized for further improvement and development of curriculum implementation.
- 8. IQAC evaluates the feedback data and conduct meetings to take decision how to improve the short comings and reach toward the betterment of the progress of students as well as Institute.
- 9. Special, Tutorial, Remedial classes are arranged for slow learners by few departments. College also takes initiatives to conduct counselling of students to reduce drop-outs.

#### Audit Recommendations:

- 1. Remedial classes for academically weaker students should be conducted regularly, with a designated time slot included in the central timetable for these sessions.
- 2. The Departments should regularly organize seminars, debates, quizzes, and mock teaching sessions for academically advanced students.
- 3. Teachers should build a Question Bank and upload the same on the college website.
- 4. The college should offer regular training sessions for faculty members to adopt innovative and student-centric teaching methods.
- 5. Teachers should be encouraged to develop e-content for effective teaching. The college should offer technical support and ensure quality assurance throughout the e-content development process. The e-content should align with learning outcomes, assessment criteria, and accreditation standards, and it should be regularly revised and updated.

- 6. The Humanities Departments in particular, should be encouraged to use the ICT facilities, so that the students and teachers can easily adapt themselves to the innovative modes of teaching.
- 7. All Departments should conduct Parent-Teacher meetings more frequently to identify and address the challenges encountered in the teaching-learning process.
- 8. The college should introduce feedback from parents, teachers, and office staff.

# 2. Faculty Profile:

### **Audit Observations:**

- 1. Three ongoing Research Project has been reported. Faculty members of Chemistry, Zoology and Microbiology are involved in this project as investigators.
- 2. In the 2022-23 academic session, faculty members have published 53research-based papers and book chapters.
- 3. A total of 9 faculty members have attended Orientation / Refresher Courses during the academic session 2022-2023.
- 4. Faculty members of this institute prepare e-learning materials and contents for the academic progress of students.
- 5. A total of 6 faculty members have acted as resource persons in different academic programmes during the academic session 2022-2023.
- 6. The college actively encourages and supports faculty members to engage in professional development programs including workshops, seminars, conferences, and online courses aimed at curriculum development and enrichment. This initiative aims to enhance both teacher quality and teaching standards.

#### Audit Recommendation:

- 1. More teachers should be encouraged to pursue research at the M. Phil and doctoral levels. The college should explore and provide adequate and advanced research facilities and resources, including laboratories, equipment, library access, journals, databases, and funding opportunities
- 2. The faculty members should also be encouraged to attend different faculty development programmes time to time.

## 3. Infrastructure:

### Audit Observations:

- At present the college has 23 class rooms. Few departments having dearth of class rooms, thus putting constraint to all classes being held in terms of the central time table. Though, departments are using library, laboratory, and seminar hall for taking their regular classes.
- There are 8 laboratories for different science departments for conducting practical classes smoothly. There is shortage of laboratory spaces in the department of Zoology, Microbiology, Physiology, Geography and Chemistry.
- A total of 80 desktop computer are available in the college. Of which 60 computers are assigned to students and 20 are reserved for the faculty members and college office.

- 4. The Science Departments of the College have a total of 6229 instruments, catering to the need of students.
- 5. All the Departments are well-equipped with high-speed (more than 100 mbps) internet and wi-fi facilities.

# Audit Recommendation:

- The College authority should look into the matter concerning the dearth of class room in the college and special attention should be paid for construction of sanctioned Science building.
- 2. The College should equip more classrooms with adequate ICT facilities and resources to facilitate the use of multimedia, online platforms, and interactive tools in teaching-learning.
- 3. The College should look into the matter to increase the number of computers and digital projectors for the interest of faculty members and students.

# 4. Library:

#### Audit Observations:

- 1. In the 2022-23 academic session, a total of 1330 books have been purchased and Rs. 500577.00 has been expended for the said purpose.
- 2. The library has continued the annual subscription (Rs. 5,900/-) of NLIST.
- Library has automation facility with library management software "Koha" (Version 21.05.13).
- 4. Barcode enabled Circulation of books has been introduced in 2022.
- 5. The library has computer with internet facility for accessing electronic resources for teaching and learning, and research purpose.
- 6. The library has a very good and well-ventilated reading area for both teachers and students.

### **Audit Recommendations:**

- 1. The library committee should take resolution about the purchase of more new books and journals.
- 2. The GB of P. R. Thakur Govt. College may take decision about the obsolete, damaged, and unused books to be disposed by adopting the weed-out policy.
- College may start Community Library Service for the local society/ neighbours for at least once in a week. For that a separate attendance and membership forms should be maintained.
- 4. ILL (Inter Library Loan) can be initiated by the P. R. Thakur Govt. College with other college libraries for Resource Sharing and for that MoU may be signed with interested college libraries of the district/state/country.
- 5. The library may maintain newspaper clippings of the news related to college by cutting and pasting the relevant news in a register.
- 6. Library should create an online repository for eBooks, journals, study materials etc.
