



An ICPR (Indian Council of Philosophical Research) sponsored lecture series on "Morals and Values in Modern Indian Society" organized by the Department of Philosophy, P. R. Thakur Government College. It was held on 14th and 18th February and 7th March, 2020. The convenor was Dr. Banani Barman, HOD of the Department of Philosophy and the organising secretary was Sucheta Mitra and treasurer was Dr. Supriya Samanta and Pritha Paul, Assistant professor of Philosophy, P. R. Thakur Govt. College. This lecture series was inaugurated by Swapan Sarkar, the Officer-in-Charge of P. R. Thakur Government college. And the inaugural session was ornamented by the presence of distinguished philosopher from academia, faculties of different Colleges and Universities, research scholars and a large number of enthusiastic students of undergraduate programme of social sciences, humanities and Science.

In the first day on 14th February, 2020, the OIC of P. R. Thakur Govt. College, in his inaugural speech had nicely described the theme "Indian Values". The inaugural session continued with a welcome speech by the coordinator of the program, Dr. Banani Barman. She had lucidly explained the main theme and the title of the first lecture "Revisiting Moral Values Embedded in Classical Indian Philosophy & Culture and Their Role in this Changing Society". It was our immense pleasure to introduce Professor Sabita Samanta as the first speaker of our three-days program. She is the HOD of Department of Philosophy at West Bengal State University. She delivered her lecture on "Revisiting Moral Values Embedded in Classical Indian Philosophy & Culture and Their Role in this Changing Society". She explained Indian thinkers recognized morality's pervasiveness throughout human life and culture, and did not shy away from enquiry into the nature of morality, right and wrong, and good and bad. On the side of "good" they placed such values as happiness, health, survival, progeny, pleasure, calmness, friendship, knowledge and truth. he "bad" were, more or less, opposites or disvalues: misery, suffering, sickness, injury, death, barrenness, pain, anger, enmity, ignorance, error and untruth. These positive and negative qualities are universalized, in principle at least, for all sentient beings, for it was felt that the highest good is possible when the whole world can enjoy the good things that the cosmos has to offer. One term in classical Indian ethical discourse is perhaps the crucial one, and the closest Indian equivalent to the notion of ethics: "dharma". This notion embodies the traditional pursuit of moral values and constitutes a distinctively essential aspect of Indian


ethical culture. "Dharma" is semantically connected with the idea of *rta*, the underlying natural order in the Hindu belief system that connects individuals, society and the universe as a whole. his constitutes an overarching social, moral and natural order that must be maintained, and that relies on human compliance with respect to renouncing selfish desires and accepting individual responsibility. In this regard the self that is anchored in dharma is inexorably a "relational social self".

In the second day on 18th February lecture theme was "Idea of M. K. Gandhi". On that day our honourable speaker was Dr. Susmita Bhowmik, Assistant Professor of Philosophy, Diamond Harbour Women's University. She has delivered her lecture on "Gandhi and Non-violence in Present Century". She nicely explained the two basic principles or ideals that guided Gandhi's life were truth and nonviolence. For him truth was God and realising this truth as God was the ultimate purpose of life. He expounded the proposition that truth could be realised only through nonviolence: "Truth is the end and nonviolence the means." Gandhi gave his own definition and explanation of nonviolence which transcended conventional understanding of the concept. For Gandhi nonviolence was not a negative concept meaning non-injury or non-killing but a positive one which meant love in the sense of selfless service of one's fellow beings which included the entire creation. The essence of his arguments is that one must try to practise nonviolence in thought word and deed and to organise all life activities on its basis, and that would bring in unprecedented and revolutionary changes in human life.

And, in the last day on 7th March lecture theme was "Message of Swami Vivekananda for young Society". On that day we were extremely pleased to introduce Professor Pravrajika Vedarupaprana, She is Vice-Principal and Monastic Professor of Department of Philosophy at Ramkrishna Sarada Mission Vivekananda Vidyabhavan. Her deliberation was on "Vivekananda on Self-confidence". It was a wonderful presentation. She explained the one central idea that comes to our mind when we think of Swami Vivekananda or read his powerful exhortations is Self-Confidence. According to Swami Vivekananda, "The history of the world is the history of a few men who had faith in themselves." Self-Confidence is the key to the success of an individual in life. Without this strong faith in oneself, man becomes a helpless toy in the hands of the powerful winds of destiny and circumstances. What is true of individuals is also true of societies and nations. The self-confidence of a society and a nation is built on the basis of the shared memories of their collective achievements. This sense of pride in their achievements bonds them together with a feeling of national pride. A nation which does not take legitimate pride in its past achievements becomes rootless and weak.

This virtual lectures was inaugurated by Swapan Sarkar, the Officer-in-Charge of P. R. Thakur Government college. And the inaugural session was ornamented by the presence of distinguished philosopher from academia, faculties of different Colleges and Universities, research scholars and a large number of enthusiastic students of both undergraduate and post graduate programme of social sciences and humanities, who are our future generation cognoscenti of Philosophy.

Critical thinking is widely regarded as a species of informal logic, although critical thinking makes use of some formal methods. In contrast with formal reasoning processes that are largely restricted to deductive methods—decision theory, logic, statistics—the process of critical thinking allows a wide range of reasoning methods, including formal and informal logic, linguistic analysis, experimental methods of the sciences, historical and textual methods, and philosophical methods. Although

we've emphasized in this guide that critical thinking skills cannot be taught in isolation from subject matter, there is a great deal of critical thinking to be learned from a subject that studies thinking itself; namely, philosophy.

In the second session, our honourable speaker was Professor Madhumita Chattopadhyay of Jadavpur University. She is also coordinator of the Centre for Buddhist Studies, Jadavpur University. She has delivered her lecture on "Critical Thinking in Buddhism". She nicely explained in Buddhism, there are five basic precepts that serve as a guide for life: no killing, no stealing, no sexual misconduct, no taking intoxicants, and no lying. These precepts guide Buddhists toward moral behaviour, and they run parallel with critical thinking and ethical decision making. The five precepts may sound simple, but there are many underlying morals and implications tied to them. This idea can be better understood by analysing one of the five-precepts.



Introduction

The notion of the Indian nation until partition primarily evoked the image of "Mother", but after independence as the so called mother got bifurcated into two separate entities, it became the need of the hour to rely upon the guardianship of a "Father" who could discipline the directionless, impoverished citizen of a newly independent country. Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi became synonymous to the idea of the Indian nation, popularly referred to as the "Mahatma", or "Bapu".

Many world leaders enlist Gandhi as one of the most significant inspiration to them in terms of the ideas of peace, religious tolerance, leadership, amelioration of the downtrodden. Gandhi belongs to the rare category of philosophers who advocated his own theory by practicing, applying them on himself.

His ideals of peace, satyagraha, primary education, experiment on celibacy, non-violence, and wearing Khadi cloth have emerged as popular rhetoric of "Gandhigiri". His policies like hungerstrike, passive political resistance are still used by the modern day protagonists of the world.

In India in recent time, Indian currency notes ensure the iconography of Gandhi is kept alive. However, gradual increase of the incidents like religious intolerance, violence against women, and violence against communities who are recognised by the government as downtrodden provokes worry about the future of the unity of nation and state.

Therefore, the need arises to academically examine Gandhian theory situating it in the post-globalised India. The question here arises wheather to explain and understand the current social pathology through Gandhian lens or is it time for an alternative epistemology beyond the ones provided by Gandhian theory.





Report of Two-Day Online Periodical Lecture on "Philosophical Contribution of Contemporary Thinkers"

Date: 19-20 March, 2022

An ICPR (Indian Council of Philosophical Research) sponsored online lecture series on "Philosophical Contribution of Contemporary Thinkers" was organized by the Department of Philosophy, P. R. Thakur Government College. It was held on 19th and 20th March, 2022 in online mode via Google Meet and YouTube live streaming (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=B8FbKbrP0zY,

https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=0vzgn5wXP1w). The convenor of the program was Dr. Supriya Samanta, other members were Dr. Banani Barman, Smt. Sucheta Mitra and Smt. Pritha paul, Assistant Professor of Philosophy, P. R. Thakur Govt. College. This online lecture series was inaugurated by Swapan Sarkar, the Officer-in-Charge of P. R. Thakur Government college. And the inaugural session was ornamented by the presence of distinguished professors of philosophy from various Colleges and Universities, research scholars and a large number of enthusiastic undergraduate and postgraduate students of social sciences and humanities.

On the first day of lecture series, i.e. on 19th March, 2022, the OIC of P. R. Thakur Govt. College, in his inaugural speech had nicely described the theme. The inaugural session was followed by a welcome address by the coordinator Dr. Supriya Samanta. Professor Pralayankar Bhattacharya of Calcutta University was the first speaker of this lecture series. His lecture entitled "Religion and Becoming Social: Swami Vivekananda" elaborated how Swami Vivekananda sought to establish a new Hindu identity under a program of national solidarity and upliftment.

In the second lecture on 19th March, 2022 Professor Dipayan Pattanayak of Jadavpur University, delivered a lecture on "Kalidas Bhattacharya: An Alternative Approach in Philosophy". He nicely explained how Kalidas Bhattacharya established his alternative standpoints in philosophy through the idea of Anekānta Vedānta. The relation between Subjectivity and Absolute, however, should be of such a nature that each can admit the other only as a subordinate movement within itself.

In the last lecture on 20th March, 2022 we had Professor Atreyee Mukherjee of West Bengal State University talked on "Parfit on Personal Identity". It was a wonderful presentation. She explained how Derek Parfit embarks on the idea of personal identity with the notion that if you believe in a soul, then it might be that you have the same soul as the person who got out of your

bed. But we have limited scope in admitting a permanent soul. If we do not have souls, then it must be either physical continuity or psychological connectedness that makes us the same person.

Finally, the lecture series was successful in delineating important philosophical issues made by three contemporary thinkers from both Indian and Western philosophical tradition. All the participants enjoyed every bit of this lecture and their active participation indicated the academic success of this program. We are very much thankful to ICPR for the financial support without which it was hardly possible to organize this lecture series.
